The Charlotte Campus has 1,126 students from 13 countries and 44 states and territories. They participate in their choice of 60 study abroad and exchange programs to 34 destinations worldwide.

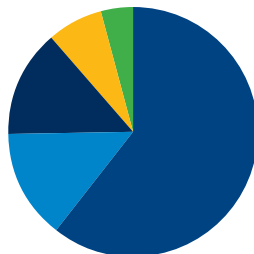
## Campus Facts

In 2002 the city of Charlotte invited JWU to open a campus in uptown Charlotte. It would allow JWU to build academic facilities from the ground up. Recognizing that its smaller, leased campus facilities in Charleston and Norfolk did not provide the ideal environment for continued evolution and strategic growth, JWU announced in 2002 that it would consolidate these two campuses into a new one in Charlotte. Campus enrollment for Fall 2023 stands at 1,126 students.

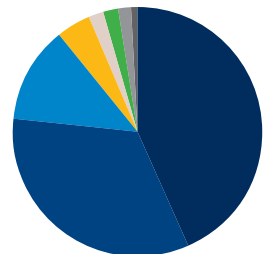
## ENROLLMENT BY COLLEGE (FALL 2023)

## Campus Facilities

The Charlotte Campus is spread across 11.75 acres and eight buildings (including a parking deck) in uptown Charlotte. These buildings include:

**Academic Center:** classrooms, auditorium, Advancement & Community Relations, College of Food Innovation & Technology, College of Hospitality Management, Health Services, Information Technology, four computer labs, 18 culinary labs, biology lab, media lab, nursing lab, science lab, culinary demonstration area, three dining rooms, events center, lounges

**Cedar Hall North and Cedar Hall South:** suite-style residence halls with 734 beds, student dining center, game rooms, common rooms, study rooms, Campus Safety & Security, Counseling Services, Facilities Management, Residential Life, Student Affairs

**Gateway Village:** bookstore, library with computer lab, College of Health & Wellness, Experiential Education & Career Services, Innovation and Entrepreneurship Center, Student Financial Services

**Gateway Center:** eight classrooms, Admissions, College of Business, John Hazen White College of Arts & Sciences, Student Academic Services

**Wildcat Center:** Athletics, Student Engagement, fitness center, group fitness room, gymnasium, locker rooms, Wildcat Den

**DoubleTree by Hilton Charlotte Hotel** (university owned)

## Financial Aid (2023–24)

JWU is committed to making a quality education as accessible and affordable as possible. The university has taken proactive steps to manage student debt by increasing institutional aid over the past several years. Approximately 99.6% of JWU Charlotte on-campus students receive institutional scholarships and/or grants from the university, often making an education at JWU more affordable than other universities.

Pell grants were awarded to 52.5% of the undergraduate students enrolled at the Charlotte Campus.

## Experiential Education

JWU students are invested in their education and intentional about their experiences, ensuring that their learning is authentic and purposeful. These students thrive in JWU's supportive community, which encourages their passion for hands-on learning, values their intellectual curiosity, and immerses them in dynamic labs and career-focused classrooms.

Employers tell us that JWU graduates demonstrate a strong work ethic, embrace challenges and ask the right kinds of questions. The university's commitment to providing students with a practical, relevant education provides industry with agile graduates who are real-world tested and are ready to enter a highly dynamic workforce.

Universitywide, in 2022–23, 1,260 students gained industry experience related to their major at 793 sites across 44 states.

In 2022–23, 81% of JWU student internships were paid. In that same year, 97.3% of internship employers rated JWU's internship program as good or exceptional.
