

**TRANSFER AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
JOHNSON & WALES UNIVERSITY
AND
CAZENOVIA COLLEGE**

This agreement, including any exhibits, incorporated by reference herein (“Agreement”), is hereby made and entered into between Johnson & Wales University, a Rhode Island non-profit organization, with a principal place of business at 8 Abbott Park Place, Providence, RI 02903 (“JWU” or “University”), and Cazenovia College, a New York non-profit educational corporation, with a principal place of business at 22 Sullivan Street, Cazenovia, NY 13035 (“CC” or “Partner”), each a “Party” and, collectively, the “Parties.” This Agreement is effective on the last date signed by both Parties (“Effective Date”).

WHEREAS, CC is developing specific plans for providing appropriate and reasonable ways for its students to pursue their education in the event that it determines voluntarily to close or its degree-granting authority and/or ability to receive disbursement of financial aid is circumscribed or curtailed by the actions of the Middle States Commission on Higher Education, New York State Board of Regents, or the United States Department of Education.

WHEREAS, one option for a school which has determined to close or has ceased to have degree-granting authority is for it to enter into an agreement with another accredited institution that will provide reasonable avenues for affected students to pursue their education.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

Consistent with regulatory and accreditation requirements for a teach-out, the Parties agree that, in the event that CC closes or loses its degree-granting authority, JWU shall be a teach-out partner for those CC programs which have been determined by both Parties to align with current JWU programs (which programs are identified in Exhibit A to this Agreement) and with new programs for which JWU wishes and is able to obtain appropriate regulatory approval, if necessary (collectively, the “Teach-Out Programs”). JWU has the necessary experience, resources, and support services to provide an educational program that is of acceptable quality for those Teach-Out Programs, and such programs are reasonably similar in content, structure, and scheduling to the comparable programs provided by CC. As much as is practically feasible, in the event of CC’s closure or loss of degree-granting authority, the Parties shall work together to coordinate the efficient and effective transfer of CC students who choose to apply for admission to JWU in the Teach-Out Programs. CC students who would be otherwise eligible for transfer to JWU under this Agreement will be excluded from the Agreement if they fail to apply, be accepted, and matriculate at JWU by September 1, 2023.

JWU agrees:

- a. All CC students in the Teach-Out Programs and in good academic standing at CC will be eligible for admission to a similar program at JWU. JWU shall, upon request, provide CC students with assistance with understanding the requisite admissions

- qualifications. JWU agrees to waive the application fee for students applying through this Agreement.
- b. CC students in the Teach-Out Programs will be considered as transfer students. To the extent not inconsistent with this Agreement, CC students in the Teach-Out Programs shall be treated in accordance with JWU policies and procedures related to transfer students.
 - c. CC students in the Teach-Out Programs will be treated in an equitable manner and afforded the same care and consideration provided to all other JWU students, and academic, administrative, and student support services and assistance will be made available to ease their transition from CC to JWU and during their academic experience at JWU.
 - d. JWU's obligations under this Agreement do not extend to any matters not explicitly covered by this Agreement. JWU assumes no responsibility for any issues or matters associated with CC's operations, closure, disposition of assets, financial aid responsibilities, debt of any kind or other currently existing or potential financial obligations, legal requirements related to closure or any other matters in any form whatsoever associated with CC's operations and/or closure.
 - e. JWU will undertake its obligations described herein at no cost to CC other than the costs associated with transferring student data and information, which shall be borne solely by CC.
 - f. For the 2023-24 academic year, JWU agrees to charge CC students admitted to JWU in accordance with this Agreement the same tuition rate that those students would have paid to CC in that same academic year.
 - g. CC students applying through this Agreement may be eligible, upon application, to receive scholarships and financial aid, including need-based grants, available through JWU in an amount equivalent to the net financial aid they received from CC in the 2022-23 academic year, provided the students continue to meet eligibility requirements for such aid. To apply for aid available through JWU, incoming CC students must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and add the JWU school code (003404). After submitting the FAFSA and a review by the JWU Financial Services Office, students will receive notification of their respective financial aid awards. Students will also be eligible to apply for undergraduate level federal and state aid (e.g., Pell, TAP).
 - h. JWU will waive its residency requirement for CC students transferring under this Agreement.
 - i. JWU will award transfer credit for coursework completed at CC only where the CC student achieved a minimum overall grade point average of 2.0 and a passing grade for all CC courses. Transfer credits are not calculated into the student's grade point average at JWU. CC students shall still be responsible for meeting program requirements and prerequisites deemed essential by JWU, and the mere fact that a student has satisfied a general education requirement at CC shall not necessarily mean that such student has satisfied a program requirement, prerequisite, or general education requirement at JWU.
 - j. CC students who enroll under this Agreement and complete their degree in accordance with all applicable JWU requirements will receive a JWU degree and diploma.

CC agrees:

- a. CC will provide a list of potential transfer students as soon as practicable. Upon request, CC shall provide JWU with any list related to CC students, including, but not limited to, lists of students who have (1) applied to CC, (2) been admitted to CC, or (3) have deposited funds with CC or signed up for classes for the upcoming academic period.
- b. CC shall promptly transmit to JWU all educational records and other related information of CC students who have elected to enroll at JWU under this Agreement so that JWU may comply with its obligations under this Agreement CC agrees to provide additional necessary information upon request.
- c. CC shall schedule opportunities for CC students to become familiar with transfer opportunities and requirements at JWU.
- d. CC shall provide CC students with guidance respecting their financial aid standing so they may evaluate their opportunities to transfer to JWU.
- e. CC shall make arrangements with appropriate third parties to transfer grants if financial aid is involved. If such arrangements cannot be completed, CC shall fully inform the affected students.
- f. Subject to any restrictions identified in New York or federal law or guidelines, for all CC students electing to transfer to JWU, CC shall promptly provide JWU with an official copy of a CC student’s transcript and a complete copy of the CC student’s admissions, academic, conduct, and financial records.
- g. CC shall direct all inquiries about the opportunity to transfer to JWU to such office or web address as JWU should designate.
- h. All records to be provided by CC to JWU shall be in a digitized format agreeable to JWU which is readily searchable and cataloged by specific academic year or term.

PROGRAMS OF STUDY: CC’s baccalaureate programs and current estimated enrollments at CC as of the time of this Agreement are delineated in the following table. Where applicable, the equivalent JWU degree program is noted. Exhibit A contains advising guides listing JWU degree requirements and course equivalencies for those programs deemed similar to those of CC.

EFFECTIVE DATE AND TERMINATION: This Agreement will become effective only upon a decision by CC to close or a loss of CC's ability to award degrees or eligibility to distribute federal financial aid. This Agreement must also be approved by the Middle States Commission for Higher Education and the New York State Education Department to become effective. The obligations under to this Agreement shall terminate when all CC students accepted by JWU pursuant to this Agreement have graduated from JWU, have failed to be continuously enrolled at JWU, or four years from the date of this Agreement, whichever comes first.

MISCELLANEOUS:

- a. The provisions of this Agreement, which supersedes all prior drafts, agreements, and understandings, oral and written, and shall be governed in all respects, including as to validity, interpretation, and effect, by the laws of the State of Rhode Island. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts (including by means of facsimile or portable document format (pdf)), each of which shall be deemed to be an original, but all of which when taken together shall constitute one and the same instrument. No Party hereto may waive, modify, or assign its rights or obligations hereunder, without the prior written consent of the other Party hereto. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of the Parties hereto and their respective permitted successors and assigns.
- b. **Confidentiality and Data Protection.** Both Parties agree that personal information shall be maintained in a confidential manner and shall not be released to any third party without the prior consent from the other Party or as otherwise permitted by

applicable law, including but not limited to the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA). In the course of dealings between the Parties, each Party represents warrants and covenants that it is capable of maintaining, and that it shall at all times maintain: appropriate safeguards for non-public personal financial information, student education records, and other protected information (“Protected Information”) relating to students. Upon student request and authorization, academic information will be provided to JWU and/or CC. Protected Information shall be held in confidence and may only be used and accessed in furtherance of the purposes set out in this Agreement. Each Party will protect such Protected Information in accordance with generally accepted commercial standards and no less rigorously than it protects its own confidential information of a similar nature. Both Parties agree to comply with all applicable data protection laws in processing and transferring Protected Information pursuant to this Agreement. CC shall be responsible for all necessary notices and consents to collect, process, and transfer Protected Information to JWU. The Parties agree to amend this Agreement as necessary to comply with applicable data protection laws.

- c. **Non-Discrimination.** Both Parties subscribe to a policy of equal opportunity and do not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, disability, religion, personal appearance, marital status, family status, family responsibilities, political affiliation, or any other basis required under applicable federal, state and local laws.
- d. **Force Majeure.** Neither Party shall be liable for failure to perform any duty or obligation under this Agreement if such failure is occasioned by reason of Force Majeure; *provided*, however, that the non-performing Party shall resume performance in accordance with the otherwise applicable terms and conditions of this Agreement as soon as practicable following abatement of such cause. Force Majeure shall mean fire, earthquake, hurricane, flood or other natural disasters, epidemics or pandemics, nuclear explosions, strikes, work stoppages, or other labor disturbances, riots or civil commotions, war or other act of any foreign nation, terrorism, power of government, or governmental agency or authority, or any other cause like or unlike any cause mentioned which is beyond the control of the Parties.

The Parties identified below agree to the provisions and terms of this Agreement.
